

Symbols



Warning of electrical voltage

This symbol indicates dangers to the life and health of persons due to electrical voltage.



Warning of explosive substances

Safety

General Power Tool Safety Warnings



Warning

Read all safety warnings, instructions, illustrations and specifications provided with this power tool.

Failure to follow all instructions listed below may result in electric shock, fire and/or serious injury.

Save all warnings and instructions for future reference.

The term *power tool* in the warnings refers to your mainsoperated (corded) power tool or battery-operated (cordless) power tool.



General Power Tool Safety Warnings – Work area safety

- Keep work area clean and well lit. Clutter or dark areas invite accidents.
- Do not operate power tools in explosive atmosphere, such as in the presence of flammable liquids, gases or dust. Power tools create sparks which may ignite the dust or fumes.
- Keep children and bystanders away while operating a power tool. Distractions can cause you to lose control.



General Power Tool Safety Warnings – Electrical safety

- Power tool plugs must match the outlet. Never modify the plug in any way. Do not use any adapter plugs with earthed (grounded) power tools. Unmodified plugs and matching outlets will reduce risk of electric shock.
- Avoid body contact with earthed or grounded surfaces, such as pipes, radiators, ranges and refrigerators.
 There is an increased risk of electric shock if your body is earthed or grounded.
- Do not expose power tools to rain or wet conditions.
 Water entering a power tool will increase the risk of electric shock.
- Do not abuse the cord. Never use the cord for carrying, pulling or unplugging the power tool. Keep cord away from heat, oil, sharp edges or moving parts. Damaged or entangled cords increase the risk of electric shock.
- When operating a power tool outdoors, use an extension cord suitable for outdoor use. Use of a cord suitable for outdoor use reduces the risk of electric shock.
- If operating a power tool in a damp location is unavoidable, use a residual current device (RCD) protected supply. Use of an RCD reduces the risk of electric shock.



General Power Tool Safety Warnings – Personal safety

- Stay alert, watch what you are doing and use common sense when operating a power tool. Do not use a power tool while you are tired or under the influence of drugs, alcohol or medication. A moment of inattention while operating power tools may result in serious personal injury.
- Use personal protective equipment. Always wear eye protection. Protective equipment such as a dust mask, non-skid safety shoes, hard hat or hearing protection used for appropriate conditions will reduce personal injuries.
- Prevent unintentional starting. Ensure the switch is in the off-position before connecting to power source and/or battery pack, picking up or carrying the tool. Carrying power tools with your finger on the switch or energising power tools that have the switch on invites accidents.
- Remove any adjusting key or wrench before turning the power tool on. A wrench or a key left attached to a rotating part of the power tool may result in personal injury.
- Do not overreach. Keep proper footing and balance at all times. This enables better control of the power tool in unexpected situations.
- Dress properly. Do not wear loose clothing or jewellery. Keep your hair and clothing away from moving parts. Loose clothes, jewellery or long hair can be caught in moving parts.
- Do not let familiarity gained from frequent use of tools allow you to become complacent and ignore tool safety principles. A careless action can cause severe injury within a fraction of a second.





General Power Tool Safety Warnings – Power tool use and care

- Do not force the power tool. Use the correct power tool for your application. The correct power tool will do the job better and safer at the rate for which it was designed.
- Do not use the power tool if the switch does not turn it on and off. Any power tool that cannot be controlled with the switch is dangerous and must be repaired.
- Disconnect the plug from the power source and/or remove the battery pack, if detachable, from the power tool before making any adjustments, changing accessories, or storing power tools. Such preventive safety measures reduce the risk of starting the power tool accidentally.
- Store idle power tools out of the reach of children and do not allow persons unfamiliar with the power tool or these instructions to operate the power tool. Power tools are dangerous in the hands of untrained users.
- Maintain power tools and accessories. Check for misalignment or binding of moving parts, breakage of parts and any other condition that may affect the power tool's operation. If damaged, have the power tool repaired before use. Many accidents are caused by poorly maintained power tools.
- Keep cutting tools sharp and clean. Properly maintained cutting tools with sharp cutting edges are less likely to bind and are easier to control.
- Use the power tool, accessories and tool bits etc. in accordance with these instructions, taking into account the working conditions and the work to be performed. Use of the power tool for operations different from those intended could result in a hazardous situation.
- Keep handles and grasping surfaces dry, clean and free from oil and grease. Slippery handles and grasping surfaces do not allow for safe handling and control of the tool in unexpected situations.



General Power Tool Safety Warnings – Battery tool use and care

- Recharge only with charger specified by the manufacturer. A charger that is suitable for one type of battery pack may create a risk of fire when used with another battery pack.
- Use power tools only with specifically designed battery packs. Use of any other battery packs may create a risk of injury and fire.

- When battery pack is not in use, keep it away from other metal objects, like paper clips, coins, keys, nails, screws or other small metal objects, that can make a connection from one terminal to another. Shorting the battery terminals together may cause burns or a fire.
- Under abusive conditions, liquid may be ejected from the battery; avoid contact. If contact accidentally occurs, flush with water. If liquid contacts eyes, additionally seek medical help. Liquid ejected from the battery may cause irritation or burns.
- Do not use a battery pack or tool that is damaged or modified. Damaged or modified batteries may exhibit unpredictable behaviour resulting in fire, explosion or risk of injury.
- Do not expose a battery pack or tool to fire or excessive temperature. Exposure to fire or temperature above 130 °C may cause explosion.
- Follow all charging instructions and do not charge the battery pack or tool outside the temperature range specified in the instructions. Charging improperly or at temperatures outsides the specified range may damage the battery and increase the risk of fire.



General Power Tool Safety Warnings – Charger use and care

- This charger can be used by children aged from 8 years and above and persons with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities or lack of experience and knowledge if they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance in a safe way and understand the hazards involved. Children shall not play with the appliance. Cleaning and user maintenance shall not be made by children without supervision.
- Never insert non-rechargeable batteries into the charger. A charger that is suitable for one type of battery pack may create a risk of fire and explosion, when used with another battery pack or non-rechargeable batteries.
- Only charge the Li-lon battery "Multiflex 20 2.0 DC" (capacity of 2.0 Ah = 5 battery cells) with the charger "Multiflex 20 – 2.0 AC". The battery voltage must match the battery charging voltage of the charger.
- Only charge the Li-lon battery "Multiflex 20 4.0 DC" (capacity of 4.0 Ah = 10 battery cells) with the charger "Multiflex 20 – 4.0 AC". The battery voltage must match the battery charging voltage of the charger.





General Power Tool Safety Warnings - Service

- Have your power tool serviced by a qualified repair person using only identical replacement parts. This will ensure that the safety of the power tool is maintained.
- Never service damaged battery pack. Service of battery packs should only be performed by the manufacturer or authorized service providers.



Device-specific safety warnings for garden pruners

- Keep all parts of the body away from the blade. Do not try to remove cut material or to hold material to be cut when the blade is running. The blade continues to run after turning off the switch. A moment of inattention when using the garden pruner can lead to severe injury.
- Carry the garden pruner by holding them by the handle
 when the blade is at a standstill. Take care not to
 actuate the switch. Carrying the garden pruner in a
 correct manner reduces the risk of unintended operation
 and injuries resulting from the blade.
- Always put the cover on the blade when transporting or storing the garden pruner. Proper handling of the garden pruner reduces the risk of injury caused by the blade.
- Please make sure all switches are turned off and the battery has been removed or switched off before removing jammed cut material or before performing maintenance works on the machine. Unexpected operation of the garden pruner when removing jammed material can cause severe injury.
- Hold the garden pruner by the insulated gripping surfaces only, as the blade may contact hidden wiring.
 Blade accessory contacting a "live" wire may make exposed metal parts of the power tool "live" and could give the operator an electric shock.
- Keep any power cables away from the cutting area.
 Cables can be hidden in hedges and bushes where they may be accidentally cut by the blade.
- Do not use the garden pruner in bad weather, especially if there is a risk of thunderstorms. This reduces the risk of being struck by lightning.



Additional safety warnings for garden pruners

- Always hold the device by the device's handle and make sure you have a secure grip. Losing control of the device may result in personal injury.
- Before starting work, search the working area for hidden objects, e.g. wire fences, hidden lines, etc.so as to prevent damage to the device and its components and to prevent the risk of an electric shock.
- Ensure the secure footing and stable positioning of the device when working with it, especially when working on slopes. Do not use the device if the intended application requires climbing a ladder or working on similar unstable footprints. Do not overreach. Walking and carrying the device is possible, but do not use the device when walking. Loss of balance can lead to loss of control of the device and cause severe injury.
- Always carry the garden pruner by holding them by the handle and when the blade is at a standstill. Always put on the protective cover after completion of the work.
- Wear suitable working clothes such as sturdy shoes
 with non-slip soles, sturdy long trousers, gloves and
 protection glasses. Use hearing protection when using
 the device. Do not wear loose clothing or jewellery as
 these can be caught in moving parts.
- Only use the device in sufficient daylight or with good artificial lighting. Lack of light or poor illumination of the working area can lead to accidents.
- Never use the device with a damaged protective cover or protective device. A defective protective cover or protective device can no longer protect you from severe injury.
- Only switch on the device if your hands and feet are out of reach of the cutting unit. This reduces the risk of injuries to hands or feet.
- Always switch off the device and remove the battery from the device if the following is the case:
 - the device is left unattended
 - before removing an obstruction
 - before checking, cleaning or maintaining the device
 - after contact with a foreign object
 - if the device starts to vibrate abnormally
- Vibrations can be harmful to the human hand-arm system. Keep the vibration exposure time to a minimum.
- Regularly check the blade for wear or damage.
- Do not attempt to slow down the blade movement by pressing against the blade once the device is switched off. The blade could be damaged or cause a kickback.
- Wait until the device has come to a standstill before putting it down. The blade could get caught resulting in a loss of control of the device.



Intended use

Only use the device PGSS 15-20V for:

- Pruning fruit trees, shrubs as well as hedges
- Cutting and shortening of branches and twigs up to a thickness of 28 mm (soft wood; reduced diameter when using hard wood)

whilst adhering to the technical data.

The device is suitable for private and commercial use.

We recommend using the power tool with original Trotec accessories.

Foreseeable misuse

This device is not suitable for large-scale lawn care or for cutting large branches (see Technical data chapter).

The device is not suitable for cutting metals, wire, steel wire, stone or plastic.

Any other use than the one described in the chapter "Intended use" is regarded as reasonably foreseeable misuse.

Personnel qualifications

People who use this device must:

 have read and understood the instructions, especially the Safety chapter.

The following persons must not use the device:

- Children.
- Persons with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities.
- Persons with lack of experience and knowledge.
- Persons unfamiliar with the instructions.




The device PGSS 15-20V is equipped with a high-quality steel blade and is ideal for cutting branches, especially of fruit trees, shrubs and hedges.


Furthermore, the device has a start lock to prevent it from being switched on unintentionally.


The battery comes with its own battery level indication. As a result, you can check the current charging status without having to connect it to the device.



Information on noise and vibration:

- The specified total vibration and noise emission values were measured by means of a test procedure standardized in EN 62841 and can be consulted for the comparison of one power tool with another.
- The specified total vibration and noise emission values can also be used for preliminary load assessment.



Caution

Vibration emissions can cause a health hazard if the device is used for an extended period of time or if it is not properly handled and maintained.

• The actual vibration and noise emission may differ from the stated values during operation of the power tool. This depends on how the power tool is used and especially on the type of workpiece being processed. Try to keep the vibration load to a minimum. Exemplary measures for reducing the vibration load include wearing gloves during operation of the tool and the limitation of working hours. All parts of an operating cycle must be considered for this (e.g. times at which the power tool is switched off and times when it is switched on but runs without load).

Transport

Before transporting the device, observe the following:

- Hold onto the mains plug while pulling the power cable of the charger out of the mains socket.
- Allow the device to cool down.
- Remove the battery from the device.
- Put the protective cover on the shear attachment.

The supplied Li-ion batteries are subjects to the requirements of dangerous goods legislation.

Observe the following when transporting or shipping Li-ion batteries:

- The user may transport the batteries by road without any additional requirements.
- If transport is carried out by third parties (e.g. air transport or forwarding company), special requirements as to packaging and labelling must be observed. This includes consulting a dangerous goods specialist when preparing the package.
 - Only ship batteries if their housing is undamaged.
 - Mask open terminals with tape and pack the battery in a way that it cannot move inside the packaging.
 - Please also observe any other national regulations.



Storage

Before storing the device, observe the following:

- Hold onto the mains plug while pulling the power cable of the charger out of the mains socket.
- Allow the device to cool down.
- Remove the battery from the device.
- Put the protective cover on the shear attachment.
- Store the device out of reach of children.
- Clean the device as described in the Maintenance chapter.
- Do not store Li-ion batteries which are completely discharged. Storing discharged batteries can lead to a deep discharge and thus damage the battery.

When the device is not being used, observe the following storage conditions:

- dry and protected from frost and heat
- Ambient temperature below 45 °C
- Protected from dust and direct sunlight

Charging the battery

Note


The battery can be damaged in case of improper charging.

Remove the charger's mains plug before inserting or removing the battery.

Never charge the battery at ambient temperatures below 10 °C or above 40 °C.

The battery is partially charged. Prior to initial start-up and when the battery is low (only the red LED in the battery level indication (8) is illuminated), the battery should be charged. To do so, please proceed as follows:

1. Slide the battery (4) onto the quick charger (5) upside down until it locks in place.




- 2. Insert the mains plug of the quick charger (5) into a properly fused mains socket.
 - ⇒ The red battery LED (6) lights up.
 - ⇒ Charging requires approx. one hour.
- 3. Wait until the red battery LED (6) goes off and the green battery LED (7) lights up.
 - ⇒ The battery (4) is fully charged.
- 4. Hold onto the mains plug while pulling the power cable of the quick charger (5) out of the mains socket.
 - ⇒ The battery (4) and the quick charger (5) may have become warm during charging.
 - Allow the battery (4) to cool down to room temperature.
- 5. Take the battery (4) out of the quick charger (5) by pressing and holding the release button (9) and pulling the battery (4) off the quick charger (5).




Inserting the battery

1. Slide the battery (4) into the holder (10) until it locks in place.



Removing the battery

1. Detach the battery (4) from the device by pressing and holding the unlocking button (9, I.) and pulling the battery off the device (II.).




2. If required, charge the battery (4) as described in the section *Charging the battery*.

Checking the battery charging status

The battery comes with an integrated battery level indication. The battery status is displayed as follows by the three LEDs of the battery level indication (8):

LED colour	Meaning
Green – Orange – Red	maximum charge / power
Orange – Red	medium charge / power
Red	weak charge – recharge the battery

- 1. Press on the battery icon (13) on the battery (4).
 - ⇒ You can read the battery status from the battery level indication (8).

- Before starting to work, check the hedge for any hidden foreign objects such as parts of garden fences.
- Only cut branches up to a thickness of max. 15 mm.

Cutting soft wood and plants

 Only cut soft wood, branches and plants up to a thickness of 28 mm.

Wear your personal protective equipment when working with the device.





1. Remove the protective cover (3) from the cutting blade (13) and the lower blade (12).




2. Press the start lock (1) to be able to actuate the on/off switch (2).




3. Press and hold the lock-off button (1) and actuate the on/ off switch (2) to cut something.

4. Release the on/off switch (2) and the lock-off button (1) after finishing your work.



5. Put the protective cover (3) on the cutting blade (13) and the lower blade (12).



Shutdown



Warning of electrical voltage

Do not touch the mains plug with wet or damp hands.

- Switch the device off.
- If required, allow the device to cool down.
- Put the protective cover on the blade.
- Hold onto the mains plug while pulling the power cable of the charger out of the mains socket.
- Remove the battery from the device (see Start-up chapter).
- Clean the device according to the Maintenance chapter.
- Store the device according to the Transport and storage chapter.

Errors and faults

The device has been checked for proper functioning several times during production. If malfunctions occur nonetheless, check the device according to the following list.

Troubleshooting tasks which require the housing to be opened must only be carried out by an authorized specialist electrical company or by Trotec.

Light smoke or odour is emitted during the first use:

 This is not a fault. These phenomena disappear after a brief runtime.

The battery does not charge:

- Check whether the battery is inserted correctly in the quick charger.
 - Slide the battery into the quick charger in a way that the battery terminals engage in the quick charger. The battery must lock in place in the quick charger.
- Check the power connection.
- Check the power cable and mains plug for damage.
- Check the on-site fusing.
- Check the quick charger for damage. If the quick charger is damaged, stop using it. Contact the Trotec customer service.
- Check the battery terminals for dirt. Remove any dirt.
- The battery might be defective and have to be replaced.
 Only use batteries of the same type.

The device does not start:

- The battery power might be too low. Recharge the battery.
- Check whether the battery is correctly connected to the device.
 - Slide the battery onto the device in a way that the battery terminals engage. The battery must lock in place in the device.
- Check the battery terminals for dirt. Remove any dirt.
- The blade is jammed. Check the blade for any potential obstruction caused by stones or branches. Do not try to remove the obstruction during operation! Switch off the device, remove the battery from the device and carefully loosen the obstruction with a suitable tool. Never reach into the blade directly with your hands.



Info

Wait for at least 10 minutes before switching the device back on.

If the cutting result is poor:

- The blade is soiled. Clean and maintain the blade according to the Maintenance chapter.
- Check the blade for damages. Do not use the device if the blade is defective. Replace a defective blade with a new one.
- The blade is blunt. Do not use the device with a blunt blade. Sharpen a blunt blade or replace the defective blade with a new one.
- The branch is too thick. Only cut branches up to a thickness of 15 mm for hard wood and 28 mm for soft wood.

The device becomes hot:

 When pruning shoots, be careful not to cut too many shoots at once. Perform slow and steady movements.

Wait for at least 10 minutes after maintenance and repair work. Only then switch the device back on.

Check the safety signs and labels attached to the device at regular intervals. Replace illegible safety signs!

Safety signs on the battery and the charger

Check the safety signs attached to the battery and the charger at regular intervals. Replace illegible safety signs!

Cleaning

The device should be cleaned before and after each use.



Warning of electrical voltage

There is a risk of a short-circuit due to liquids penetrating the housing!

Do not immerse the device and the accessories in water. Make sure that no water or other liquids can enter the housing.

- Clean the device with a soft, damp and lint-free cloth.
 Make sure that no moisture enters the housing. Protect electrical components from moisture. Do not use any aggressive cleaning agents such as cleaning sprays, solvents, alcohol-based or abrasive cleaners to dampen the cloth.
- Dry the device with a soft, lint-free cloth.
- Clean the blades with a soft brush and oil them with universal oil spray after each use.
- Keep the connecting terminals on the device and charger clean.




Self-locking nuts may only be used once. Use a new self-locking nut to mount a new blade.

If the movable cutting blade is blunt or worn, it must be replaced.

- ✓ The device is switched off.
- ✓ The battery is removed from the device.
- 1. Remove the self-locking nut (M8, SW13) (14), the wave washer (15) and the washer (16).
- 2. Remove the screw bolt (17).
- 3. Remove the old cutting blade (13).



- 4. Insert the new cutting blade.
- 5. Reinsert the new screw bolt (17).
- 6. Place the washer (16) and the wave washer (15) on the screw bolt (17).
- 7. Tighten a new self-locking nut (M8, SW13) on the screw bolt (17).
